

## Key Stage 1



### Lego man

As part of the homes topic being taught in year 1, the children have been lucky enough to have the 'Lego man' in.

## Key Stage 2

Two year groups in Key Stage 2 have had the opportunity to have some real hands on experiences based on the topics they have been learning.

Year 3 went exploring Poole Cavern as part of their topic on rocks. They had an exciting day exploring the caverns learning about rocks and how caves are formed.

Year 6 had a visit from The Derby Museum Archaeology Team where they got to explore what life was like in Viking Britain. They even got the chance to meet a real life Viking!

The children learnt a lot about Vikings as well as having a really enjoyable day.
