Thank you for your continuing support



Nursery

Goldilocks and the three bears is very popular at the moment! Our next parent's activity session is on 4th February - morning and afternoon. It is linked to the theme of Polar Bear Polar Bear. There will be a range of activities for parents to do with their children who are all very excited!



Foundation Stage 2 Rabbit, Squirrel and Lemur Class are really enjoying learning through themes linked with a range of story books (fiction) and information books (non-fiction). The Jolly Postman has been delivering post in the form of letters and parcels. Encourage your child to look at different types of letters you receive in the post. Explore the different styles of letters; hand written, letter, junk mail, flyers, invitations and cards. Collect some and bring them to school.

Feed Me Fridays!

FS2 have started "Feed me Fridays" where children will be taught to understand and apply basic rules of safety and hygiene associated with food preparation, cooking and making choices for a healthy balanced diet focus this term is on making different types of sandwiches using fillings ranging from egg, cucumber, cheese, cress honey and marmite!

Happy New Year from the Key Stage One Team Key Stage 1

All the children are settling back into a new year of learning, in their newly refurbished classroom.

Year 1 are busy preparing for phonics screening in June. This is a national test to check the reading ability of all year one children. They had a practise in January to help them prepare and so their teachers know what sounds to focus on next. You can help your child at home too, by practising their sounds with them, hearing them read and playing phonic games on the computer. Year 2 are working very hard preparing for their SATs tests in June. They are doing lots of practise to make sure they achieve their best in the real tests. Please help support your child at home by listening to them read, completing any homework tasks with them and talking about their learning. A problem that comes up regularly in school is the itchy one of nits. Outbreaks are common in any community where children play and work together in close contact. Head lice are not fussy – 20% of community outbreaks fall amongst the over 16's and under 4's! Live eggs and head lice are not easily spotted on the head, therefore the school nurse cannot solve the head louse problem for schools and parents – especially as they can take up to 10 days to hatch.

As well as visiting the 'bug'busting' website for advice, why not try this aromatherapy based solution whenever there is a breakout:

use a base of olive oil with 6 drops Citronella, 6 drops Tea Tree and 6 drops Eucalyptus essential oil in and comb through with a nit comb every evening for a week
